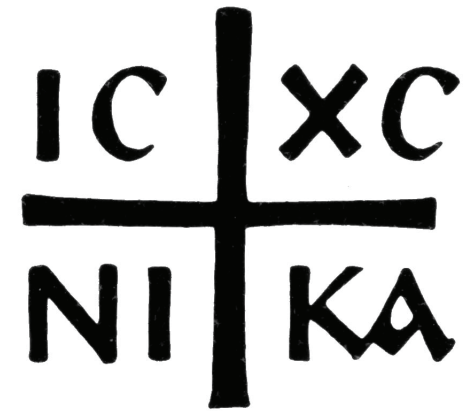

The Annual Conference on Christian Legal Thought, sponsored by the Lumen Christi Institute and The Law Professors' Christian Fellowship, brings scholars from across the country to present papers and consider questions that address the intersection of law and the Christian tradition. Each year, panels are selected that focus on contemporary legal issues that engender philosophical and theological reflection. Occasionally drawing on experts in academic disciplines outside of law, the conference enriches thought and broadens understanding as Christian legal academics examine the role that law plays in shaping our common culture.

As in the past, the invited speakers for this year's Lumen Christi-Law Professors' Christian Fellowship Conference on Christian Legal Thought will present papers on a number of topics of interest to the Christian legal community. One panel will address the different approaches to law found in Christianity and Islam, how they disagree and where they intersect. Another panel will address how Christian law professors should counsel law students in light of the challenges facing students in the current economic climate. Two additional panels will involve law professors presenting works in progress on a wide variety of topics.

Founded by Catholic scholars at the University of Chicago in 1997, the Lumen Christi Institute has organized many conferences and lectures focusing on topics in law and culture. Since 1996, the Law Professors' Christian Fellowship has hosted an annual conference for Christian law professors, co-hosted for the last six years with Lumen Christi. The annual conference, in bringing together legal educators, seeks to reinvigorate society with the seeds of faith and deeper reflection by inspiring those responsible for training and forming the next generation of leaders.
